Maintenance Minute

I have touched on this before, but with new owners, it is worth revisiting. Every unit has a main shut off for water. In the townhomes it is typically near your washing machine.

In buildings 1,8 & 9 it is under the sink in the hallway bathroom. Except for the top floors, in which case it is usually near your washing machine on the floor. In buildings 2 & 3 it is located in your water heater closet. It is a good idea to not only familiarize yourself with where your shut off is located, but to also test it. In an event of an emergency you want to be sure they work. Many owners have replaced theirs over the years, but many have not. I strongly suggest you replace your shut offs if they are not functioning properly. If you need a recommendation for a plumber, I can help. In order to replace them, the water would need to be shut off to the entire building. This would have to be scheduled with me through the week.


